Smith's Sloths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • keeping personal information safe • recognise situations where content might not be safe e.g. emails texts and videos • know who to go to for help • understand why usernames and passwords are important to use online to keep them safe • know and follow rules for age restrictions when online
Hanson's Hedgehogs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Electronic communication • Appropriate content online • What to do if children see something upsetting • Cyberbullying
Egan's Eagles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passwords and keeping them safe • Ignoring emails asking for private information (phishing) • Identifying trustworthy websites • Consequences of sharing personal information online • What to do if you see something you are uncomfortable with
